Approach

Lismore City Council commissioned a MARKYT[®] Community Scorecard to:

- Support a review of the Community Strategic Plan, Delivery Plan and Operational Plan
- Assess overall perceptions of Lismore City Council as a place to live, work and visit
- Determine community aspirations and priorities
- Assess performance levels and service gaps
- Benchmark performance against other councils





The Study

Lismore City Council commissioned CATALYSE[®] to conduct an independent MARKYT[®] Community Scorecard.

All community members were invited to take part. Scorecard invitations were sent to all households and residential PO Boxes in Lismore City Council using Australia Post's unaddressed mail services. Respondents could complete the scorecard in hard copy or online.

CATALYSE[®] sent email invitations to Lismore City Council's customer contacts, and the Council provided supporting promotions through various communication channels.

The scorecard was open from 4 to 25 November 2024.

The scorecard was completed by **1,678 community members** with various connections to the Council:


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




Q. How would you rate performance in the following areas?

Q. How would you rate performance in the following areas?






How to read the MARKYT 📀 Benchmark Matrix


This line represents okay performance based on the MARKYT Performance Index Score. Higher performing service areas are placed above this line while lower performing areas are below it.





Community Action Plan Local roads (including bridges)

Community driven actions

Community Voices

"More prompt attention to road maintenance to improve overall road deterioration."

"General maintenance - roads seem to be allowed to deteriorate to a level where they then require significant investment to bring them back to a reasonable standard. If we invested more in general maintenance maybe they wouldn't get to that point."

> "Employ more efficient contractors to build and repair roads using better technology and methods."

"Local roads / bridges. Require regular dirt road repair and maintenance. Require regular weed control along roads to ensure visibility (especially single lane roads). need to improve materials and workmanship on road repairs. Poor quality control on sub-contractors."

"The roads in Lismore are the absolute worst in the State. Two blocks from the CBD the roads are nothing less than patchwork of potholes. Spend some money on these goat tracks - it is a reflection of how much the council actually cares about this area."

"Fix the damaged roads properly the first time. Not quick fixes they just don't work. Bring private contractors in and hold them responsible for their work."

"This is an ongoing issue and needs careful planning on how to maintain the condition better. Perhaps instead of a bandaid solution with patching holes, fix the road section properly with a better foundation."

"Roads and stormwater all need to be working 100% - Stormwater drains along the roads invariably blocked "by rubbish - Clean them up."

"Drains are not being unblocked and it's causing areas of roads to hold water which is further affecting the surface of the road and causing potholes."

"Fix our roads and manage road maintenance including potholes, dangerous verges and visibility from overgrown scrub, trees and noxious weeds."



- Maintain and repair roads regularly to prevent deterioration:
 - Implement long-term solutions, not temporary "band-aid" fixes
 - Hold contractors accountable for their work
 - o Use the best material and techniques
- In particular:
 - Address potholes with substantial repairs rather than patching
 - o Repair and clean drains
 - Keep roadsides clear of weeds and vegetation

Community Action Plan Flood mitigation and resilience planning

Community Voices

"Develop a mitigation plan and communicate this to our community."

"Having a plan, helping community members decide what to do for the next flood event. Everyone rebuilt where they are as there was no leadership. Are we going to keep rebuilding after each flood and just continue with our half-developed town? What is the plan for the next flood? Is the CBD moving?"

> "We need constant update on plans for flood mitigation. People are worried nothing is being done."

"It is obvious. Residences on the floodplain need to be moved to safe ground. Businesses can up and move more easily and reset."

"Stop approving any housing in the flood zone and preferably relocating the city centre. After all the floods in Lismore's history it is absolutely ridiculous to have any housing in the flood zone."

"We need a focus on an alternative CBD location that is safe from major flooding, with incentives and support for current businesses to move out of the floodplain, to prevent massive negative financial and social impacts that future floods will have."

"[We] need an immediate focus on engineering-based solutions, such as the construction of flood levees or retention basins, to actively mitigate flood risks."

"Activate effective strategies to mitigate future flooding - build a new dam, dredge the river, regular clearing of within the city, encourage growth out of flood prone areas."

"Deeper River - restore dredging. Build the Dunoon Dam. Create reclamation dams in the catchment like Toowoomba did. Revamp the CBD drainage systems for stormwater."

"Take note of the CSIRO study report when it is completed. Implement effective and evidence-based flood mitigation measures using the information in the report."

> "Total commitment to the CSIRO report when it's released. Investors need confidence to set up business in Lismore."



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 Develop a master plan for flood mitigation and keep the community informed about what has been done and what will be done.

• Consider relocating the CBD and residential areas out of the flood plain.

- Commence engineering-based solutions including:
 - o Building another dam
 - o Dredging the river
 - o Improving drains and keeping them clean
- · Implement CSIRO recommendations.

Community Action Plan Stormwater management and drainage

Community driven actions

Community Voices

"Bigger cement drains, regular cleaning."

"Better drain infrastructure. Drains aren't deep or wide enough and outdated."

"Lismore's storm water management systems are obviously woefully inadequate and/or inadequately maintained to prevent blockage and massive overflow in heavy rains. They need regular cleaning out and a lot of work to improve them."

"There needs to be a complete overhaul of all drains in the South Lismore area from Union Street to Wilsons road from Elliot road to Charles street. In some places there are no drains!! Ditch drains that have too small a flow-in pipe. Some cases the pipes are old ceramic ones that have passed their use by date."

"All drains to be maintained. Hate seeing water backing up and entering people's garages and blocks of land. People in South Lismore trying to recover from floods and then water enters their blocks every time we get a storm."

"The infrastructure is there, however it MUST be maintained all the time. Plants/ grasses etc. growing in the cracks of the concrete channels have to be cleared and the verges in the larger unlined channels like on Dawson St have to be consistently tended to. This has to be LGA wide."

"Drains need to be flushed and cleaned out on a regular basis as trees and other vegetation gets washed into the drains and then this causes minor flooding in areas that don't need more water cause council can't do their job."

"Regularly clean drains. Make sure pumps are working."

"Improved pumps to get stormwater out of the basin before it comes over the levee."

"Keep all stormwater drains cleaned regularly and dredge the rivers like they used to be done. This would help to lower the river water level. Make sure the flood pumps are maintained and working at all times."

"Stop Lismore flooding from drainage before the river rises above the levee bank - as was seen in March 2017. Have all pumps and systems ready for use at all timesinstead of taking years to fix pumps that don't work."



- Regularly maintain and improve stormwater drain infrastructure:
 - Repair and upgrade existing drains
 - o Install more drains as needed
 - Keep drains clear of vegetation, rubbish and debris
- Maintain flood pumps and install more pumps to meet local needs.

Community Action Plan Rebuilding Lismore / Flood recovery program

Community driven actions

Community Voices

- Develop and communicate a clear vision for Lismore's future, ensuring the community is consulted, listened to and kept well-informed about recovery efforts, timelines and future plans.
- Expedite the rebuilding process for essential infrastructure, businesses and homes damaged in the flood.
- Plan to relocate houses and businesses out of flood-prone areas, with new land releases.
- Create more affordable housing outside of flood-prone areas.
- Advocate for Government support for floodaffected businesses and provide incentives for businesses to return to the CBD.

"A clear plan and vision for our town's future. Where is it headed? How will be return to being a Regional Centre that attracts people to live here, to build businesses here. How do we prevent more people and businesses from leaving our wonderful City."

"Actually consult with the community who are directly and deeply affected by the flood events at the point of the event, what are their needs and hopes?"

"Clear timelines and progress updates, timetables of actions for people to plan around."

"Expedite rebuilding and recovery to bring life back into Lismore city. The centre is run down and unappealing."

"Faster action - it's been nearly 3 years since the devastating floods. Clean up Lismore quicker/better- it looks like a dead city that hasn't improved much since February 2022, with all the flood destroyed houses and buildings on display continually!! This sight isn't doing much at all for the development of Lismore."

> "Things need to move faster. More affordable land where flood-prone houses could be relocated to needs to be identified."

"Educate people where to live - open up more acres at affordable prices."

"Put a plan in place to move the city centre and housing out of the flood zone."

"No new developments on the flood plain. Ensure everybody is off the floodplain including businesses - how many times can the government bail us out? It's cheaper to just buy back and get them out of North and South Lismore."

"Keep lobbying state and federal governments for financial assistance "persistently" for the benefit of the rebuild well into the foreseeable future. Aim to keep our labour force in the local area by offering housing assistance or financial enticements."

"Focus a lot more on small business improving access to government funds and cut the red tape for new business (including the funds needed). We need more people to invest in Lismore and small business is the backbone of all small city's economy."



Community Action Plan Responsible growth and development

Community driven actions

- Support development of affordable housing outside of flood-prone areas:
 - allow subdivision and medium density development
 - o release new land for development
 - o streamline development processes
- Plan new developments with access to essential services and infrastructure, including transport routes, shops, recreation and health services.
- Stimulate economic growth by;
 - attracting and supporting a variety of businesses and industry
 - reducing red tape for business applications
 - o relocating the CBD out of the flood plain
 - o promoting tourism

Community Voices

"Town planning that takes into account affordable housing and retail spaces. Smaller, cheaper housing options, taking up less room, out of flood zones. Safe and accessible social housing. Duplexes and complexes that meet multiple community needs."

"Help facilitate Lismore's growth and development as a major NSW regional centre via promoting good subdivision design and development with suitable local affordable housing design aesthetically suitable for the region".

> "Permitting multiple dwellings on larger land holdings, particularly adjacent to good transport routes."

"To allow growth, we need a steadily growing population. For this we need more land for housing. The amount of time it takes to get through the approval process is crazy."

> "Responsible growth / development. Need to limit development in areas without adequate road infrastructure."

"Ensure the town planning includes space for local shops, restaurants, cafes, gyms etc, not just housing. Goonellabah is a great example of terrible town planning. Create little villages with something to do."

"A coordinated infrastructure delivery program to support new greenfield areas and in-fill around the health precinct. A clear vision about what population level we are aiming to support."

"Priority for expanded industry and jobs in council area. Agriculture and manufacturing services maintain a solid financial base for the community and region."

"Streamlining and making the DA processes easier. More support for businesses including businesses outside the CBD."

"Responsible growth and development would mean relocating the CBD and starting from scratch. Yes this would mean an unknown amount of funding needed to do, but it would be irresponsible to leave the CBD and even allow it to reopen, where it is."

"More opportunities to businesses and tourism to promote people accessing Lismore as a hub for the Northern Rivers, including festivals, activities for families and activities on weekends and evenings."



Community Action Plan Youth services

Community driven actions

Community Voices

"Activities and safe places for young persons, 8 to 18, to attend and gather after school and up to 8pm."

"There are limited youth services in the Lismore area. For example, a youth centre providing a safe drop-in service for young people to engage in activities, seek support and guidance."

"There MUST be a youth space in Lismore. There is no youth centre/ youth hub/ or location that is specific for young people. We know that youth crime is an issue in Lismore and evidence shows if young people are engaged in activities and connected to a space in which they feel safe, i.e a youth centre, then these rates of youth crime reduce drastically."

"Create programs to have them involved, engage with them on projects so they feel connected. They are set to inherit the decisions we make today, when they become rate payers on a few short years. Build the trust, relationship and experiences with them now for the best outcomes in the future."

> "Improved communication with the youth to see what they would like. Try to engage them in safe social and community activities."

"Teenagers need more activities. More clubhouses. More to do on a Friday or Saturday night, in the CBD (no drugs or alcohol events). Music, gaming, craft, cooking .. .or indoor games etc). A free shuttle bus to pick them up and drop them home. Do a trial, cap it at just say 20 people, start small...their word of mouth will triple it in no time."

"There's nothing for teens, now that ten pin and movies gone. Need more for teens to do. Need a movie theatre, ten pin, rec centre eg pinball, pool hall etc for teens to have safe social gathering."

"Free bus travel around the region for under 21's. Bring more music events to Lismore. Find out what's happening with the cinema and help get it up and running."

"Transport for youths to get around is practically non-existent except for school buses."



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 Provide a youth centre and other safe spaces for young people to gather and socialise.

- Engage youth leaders and mentors to run activities and programs to support, educate and guide young people.
- Provide a wider range of sporting and nonsporting activities and events to engage young people.
- Provide public transport or free community buses to help young people access local services and activities.

Community Action Plan Waste management

Community driven actions

Community Voices

"Re-instate weekly garbage collections. The current cycle is a health hazard sitting in everyone's yards."

"The rubbish situation is horrible. Green rubbish fortnightly now. Very hard to keep on top of yard management - very disappointing. Very expensive to take rubbish to dump, hence rubbish dumped on the side of the road."

> "Bring back the bigger bins and don't charge people for recycling. Higher tip fees will lead to more roadside dumping."

"The LCC has started demanding payment for recycling cardboard and plastics. Free recycling should be a priority and encouraged rather than expecting people to pay . . . dumping of rubbish is a result of the new payment regime."

> "Waste and recycling improvements. Bring drop off facilities back to town. We shouldn't have to go to the dump for recycling small amounts. People just say forget it and it goes in the bin."

"Waste Management. (1) Lobbying State / Federal Governments to develop soft plastic recycling schemes. (2) More locations to drop off recycling materials such as small batteries - Local village shops."

"Have lithium battery and other batteries drop offs at recycle centres for bottles, cans etc. So public can practice the right way of disposal. Have more recycle bins in CBD, you have to walk a way to find them. Put them in car parks as well."

"Recycle facilities should have the ability to collect and recycle soft plastics which are a big problem. Encourage shops to take back any excess packaging for recycling. Make the revolve centre free so people will reuse unwanted items."

"Bring back free tip vouchers for ratepayers. Implementing roadside large rubbish pickups. Put back the previous regular bin collection system."

"Implementing an annual kerbside collection would offer significant benefits for Lismore City Council, including reducing illegal dumping, encouraging proper waste disposal, and fostering community satisfaction."



- Provide change management support to assist community members to transition to the new waste program.
- Consider if bin sizes and the frequency of collections are appropriate.
- Review recycling services, with consideration for charges, a central recycling facility and more recycling drop-off points for soft plastics, batteries etc.
- Consider bulk waste services, such as an annual kerbside collection or free tip passes, to reduce illegal dumping.

Ideas are grouped into 42 service areas.










Q. How would you rate performance in the following areas?




Out of area ratepayers / visitors
